90-MINUTE "SUPER BOWL SUNDAY SPECIAL" PRE-GAME PROGRAM KICKS OFF
CBS TELEVISION NETWORK SPORTS SUPER BOWL X COVERAGE, JAN. 18

CBS Television Network Sports will go down to the sea in a ship for its coverage of Super Bowl X on Sunday, Jan. 18, beginning at 12:30 PM, ET.

An expanded 90-minute special version of the broadcasts with which it introduced coverage of 86 regular-season games, plus the NFC playoff and championship contests, opens Super Bowl Sunday on the CBS Television Network.

Brent Musburger, Phyllis George and Irv Cross, hosts of the "Super Bowl Sunday Special," will step aboard the "Thomas Cat," a 57-foot Chris Craft Constellation, at the Palm Bay Club in Miami. CBS Sports leased the craft from Neil Cargile Jr., a Nashville, Tenn., businessman-sportsman.

As the "Thomas Cat," to be renamed "The Super Bowl Special," cruises down Biscayne Bay toward the Orange Bowl, the Super Bowl Sunday hosts will entertain and interview celebrities from the worlds of sports and show business.

Included in the party-time festivities will be remote pick-ups and interviews from such locations as the Fontainebleau Hotel, the Miamarina, and The Bowl Bar, a watering hole across from the game site.

The Super Bowl Sunday hosts, who will utilize the 50-yard line presidential box for half-time and post-game activities, will arrive

at the Miamarina in time to sample a fur and bikini fashion show for players' wives before a helicopter picks them up for a televised ride to the Orange Bowl, about two miles away.

Along with a look at points of interest and late pre-game developments, the broadcast will show highlights of the past nine Super Bowls.

So, up to kickoff time between the Pittsburgh Steelers and the Dallas Cowboys, all the ballyhoo and high spirits already associated with the week will be summarized in CBS Television Network Sports own "Super Bowl Sunday Special."

EQUIPMENT LOGISTICS:

18 cameras, including one in the Goodyear blimp, four videotape machines, four slomotion, stop action discs, and two vidifonts. In addition, 60 microphones and 110 monitors will be employed for the pre-game, and postgame activities, along with three miles of video cable and four miles of audio cable at the Orange Bowl. Ten vehicles will be used for engineering and production.

Pat Summerall, play-by-play, Tom Brookshier, analyst.

BROADCAST STATISTICS:

221 stations in the United States, including Alaska and Hawaii, will carry the broadcasts of the 90-minute Super Bowl pre-game program, "Super Bowl Sunday Special," and Super Bowl X. In addition, 378 CBC stations in Canada (308 English language and 70 French stations), plus stations in Puerto Rico, Mexico, Japan, Australia and London, England, will carry the game. American Forces Television will also broadcast Super Bowl X in Seoul, Okinawa, Berlin, Germany, the Philippines, Thailand, and Panama. Nine other countries will see the contest on videotape and 19 others on film.
